PETALING JAYA: There have not been such effusive birthday greetings for a civil servant in recent memory.

From a TikTok video of a four-year-old girl to Twitter messages by a Mentri Besar and the Royal Malaysian Navy, Malaysians sent their birthday wishes to Health director-general Datuk Dr Noor Hisham Abdullah, who turned 57 vesterday.

Dr Noor Hisham has been the Health director-general since 2013. His daily updates and explanations about the ministry's strategies in countering the Covid-19 pandemic have endeared him to the Malaysian public.

The flood of greetings yesterday came not just from ordinary folk, but also from "big boys" such as Malaysia Airports, which post-
